Exciting updates from BVU:

- BVU's free application for the 2022-23 academic year opened July 1, earlier than ever before, to allow students more time to apply.
- We became test optional Fall 2020 and beyond. Based on our mission of Education for Service, we decided to break down barriers to a college education by helping all students through a holistic application review. BVU is committed to helping first-generation students achieve their dream of a college education.
- Students can also apply with the Common Application opening Aug. 1. Every year, just like our main application, this will be free for students.
- During Summer 2022, BVU approved the establishment of two new co-ed club sports: archery and trap shooting. These two join the ranks of the already growing list of club sports on campus including rodeo, livestock showing, esports, and robotics! The newcomers are set to begin practice in the Fall of 2022 with student interest already at a high.
- Our renovated Library opened in September 2020 and features new spaces for our Center for Academic Excellence, 2Fix IT support services, and more spaces for student success.

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
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ADMISSIONS COUNSELOR TERRITORIES

IMPORTANT DATES

June 1: Seniors can sign up for a visit at <u>bvu.edu/visit</u>. Receive a Beaver Visit Grant for \$1,000 per year just for visiting campus.

July 1: Our free application opened. Seniors can apply at <u>bvu.edu/apply.</u>

<u>Aug. 1</u>: The free Common Application opens. Students can select BVU as a school to submit their application using this method.

<u>August</u>: Application decisions will be mailed out and will include any merit scholarships the student may initially receive.

Oct. 1: Students can fill out the Free Application for Federal Aid (FAFSA) at <u>FAFSA.gov</u> using BVU's school code: 001847

November & Beyond: After a student is accepted and completes the FAFSA, we will send a financial aid offer to them. Once they receive their offer, it is important the student talks with their admissions counselor to review it.

Anytime: Students can also look for other scholarships at bvu.edu/scholarships.

May 1: Students can deposit to save their spot any time before May 1 which is our 'save your spot' deadline. This lets us know if the student will be joining the Beaver family in the Fall of 2023. Students can make their deposit any time after they are accepted at <u>bvu.edu/deposit</u>.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Students will have the choice to apply through Regular Admissions or Test Optional:

- Regular Admissions: Students submit their transcript and ACT/SAT to BVU for review.
- **Test Optional**: Students submit their transcript to BVU for review. If a student is accepted and then enrolls, they will be asked to submit any tests scores they may have for class placement. If the student has no test scores to submit, they may need to take a placement exam during Registration to determine what classes are best for them.

Based on the information that the student provides, we will make a holistic decision for admission and scholarships based on the classes they have taken, extra curriculars, and overall involvement in the communities they call home. If we feel we do not have enough information from a student, we may request more information to make a fair and equitable decision.

The average GPA for the incoming class of 2020 was 3.45 and the average ACT score was 21.5.

Recommended high school coursework

- 4 years English
- 3 years math through algebra II
- 2 years history and/or social sciences
- 3 years sciences (including at least 2 lab courses)
- 4 units of academic electives (religion, philosophy, or additional units of mathematics, science, foreign language)

Advice for students

- 1. **Meet with their high school counselor.** Students can work with counselors to develop an action plan to prepare for college.
- 2. Visit college campuses. Select a variety of institutions which could include a large university, a smaller, more personal college, one located in an urban area, and one in a rural setting. We recommend visiting a school that is close to home as well as one that is more than 200 miles away. Many colleges today use the campus visit as a signal of a student's interested in their school. If XYZ College is their top choice, it's a good idea to visit or arrange for a regional meeting, attend college fairs or college night programs. Talk about college with people they respect—teachers, counselors, family members.
 - a. Students should not rule out a school because of costs. Scholarships and financial aid are designed to help meet educational expenses.
 - b. Begin to narrow their choices down to a few schools that are high on their list.
- 3. **Take the ACT/SAT.** Most colleges encourage students to take the ACT/SAT twice. If students don't get the score they anticipated, they can take it again.
 - a. Some colleges are test optional, but testing can help with placement into classes.

- 4. **Complete a Net Price Calculator.** The net price calculator can help a student and their family determine their eligibility for assistance at a number of schools in which they have an interest.
- 5. **Don't slack off during your senior year.** Scholarship decisions include a student's senior results. By continuing to work hard, they might end up with a larger academic award.

TIP: We encourage students to take as many challenging courses—Advanced Placement, Honors, or International Baccalaureate—as they can comfortably handle. Most colleges encourage students to take challenging courses. We often get asked if taking a challenging curriculum and getting lower grades is better than taking "easier" classes and getting all A's. The reality is colleges do encourage students to take challenging courses and we also expect them to do well in those classes! That isn't to say a B is awful, but we want you to take challenging courses and earn good grades in these classes. But many schools do accept weighted GPA, which can help with scholarships.

*Students who live off campus will have their scholarship reduced by \$5,000. Students who provide test scores or class rank could increase their scholarship.

Legacy scholarship:

- \$1,000 per year
- Award for any student beginning enrollment at BVU who has a parent or grandparent with a degree from BVU

Beaver Visit Grant

- \$1,000 per year
- Award available to students who attend an individual or group visit any time between June 1, 2022, and May 31, 2023

Invest in Rural Iowa Scholarship

- Up to \$5,000 per year for four years
- Award available to first-year Storm Lake campus students
- Students must hail from one of the following 19 Northwest Iowa counties: Buena Vista, Calhoun, Cherokee, Clay, Dickinson, Emmet, Humboldt, Ida, Kossuth, Lyon, Palo Alto, Plymouth, Pocahontas, O'Brien, Osceola, Sac, Sioux, Webster, and Woodbury. Preference given to students who have demonstrated financial need
- Have a strong academic record
- Have been an active participant in school and their local community through organization involvement and volunteering

Fine and Media Arts Scholarships

- \$2,000 per year
- Awards available for animation, art, art therapy, graphic design, scientific illustration, digital media, or music production, instrumental or vocal music; both those majoring in these disciplines or participating in the associated cocurricular program
- Students must complete an audition or provide a portfolio by Feb 28, 2023 or within 30 days if accepted after Feb. 28.

Education for Service (EFS) Scholars

- Engage in a supportive cohort with staff and faculty mentors and peers to foster your success through service, mentorship, leadership, professional skills, and educational
- opportunities including priority to participate in an annual alternative week of learning trip.
- To be eligible: Students must graduate from a high school located in Buena Vista County, earn a minimum 3.0 high school GPA, be a first-generation college student, and have a dedication to service or leadership. Students must be admitted to BVU and apply for the scholarship by Nov. 1.

Honors Institute

- The Honors Institute encourages Buena Vista University's best and brightest students to develop their academic talents beyond the regular curriculum through specialized courses and an extensive research project under the direction of a faculty mentor. Participation in the program cultivates critical thinking skills and the development of a sophisticated intellectual disposition.
- Required: 3.75 GPA and top 10% class rank
- Brief application
- Benefits include:
 - \$2,500 travel stipend
 - Priority class registration
 - Research and conference funding

Multicultural Scholarship

- Required: 3.25 or greater GPA. Students must also demonstrate abilities in and/or desire to be engaged in campus multicultural-based activities and organizations.
- Will interview with the Center of Diversity & Inclusion
- \$4,000 additional award stacked on top of the merit scholarship
- Students admitted before Jan. 30 must interview by Feb. 28. Students admitted after Jan. 30 must interview within 30 days of admission. Students admitted after May 1 are not eligible.

Cocurricular Scholarships

- Available to first-year Storm Lake campus students
- Awarded to students based on talent and individuals who are dedicated to continued improvement in their respective areas of activity
- Scholarships awarded in marching band, dance & cheer, rodeo, livestock showing, and esports
- Award amounts vary
- Ask your admissions counselor how you may qualify

Out-of-State Grant

- Available to any U.S. resident who resides outside of Iowa

Clubs and Organizations

There are more than 50 student organizations. Three out of every four students are involved in at least one. That's not too surprising when you look at the variety of organizations available, ranging from the Society of Collegiate Journalists, BVU Marketing Association and Student Senate, to Outdoor Adventure Club, Brazilian Jiu Jitsu Club and African American Student Association.

Marching and Pep Bands

Buena Vista University's marching and pep band program allows students to participate in an intercollegiate athletic band experience like no other in the American Rivers Conference.

Outdoor Recreation

Students also have many opportunities to participate in fun outdoor activities on campus or in Storm Lake including, but not limited to, cardboard boat races, jack-o'-lantern carving, camping, cross-country skiing, kayaking, canoeing, and snow tubing. We aim to give back to the environment and community while spreading an appreciation for the outdoors.

Academic Support

Center for Academic Excellence

The Center for Academic Excellence (CAE) offers free academic support, such as tutoring and study skills enhancement for all Buena Vista University students. Whether students are in need of extra help or simply want to enrich their educational experience, the CAE can help.

The CAE works with students who, due to a disability, are seeking academic accommodations. BVU policy, in accordance with state and federal guidelines, calls for reasonable accommodations to be made for qualified students. To assure that this policy is upheld the director of the CAE serves as coordinator for the appropriate and reasonable accommodations and is available to assist students in the student accommodation process.

Math Shop and Writing Lab

The CAE houses the math shop and the writing lab, which accommodate drop-in visits or pre-arranged appointments to help students with coursework. The math shop provides tutoring for students in science, math, and business courses. The CAE also offers one-on-one tutoring upon request for specific courses other than those covered by the math shop's regular schedule. The tutors at the CAE are BVU students who have been chosen because of their academic and teaching skills. The writing lab has adopted the motto "continuous improvement, not instant perfection" and provides tutors who guide students through the writing process from brainstorming a topic to creating an outline to revising a completed draft. Students use this service while enrolled in writing courses or while taking courses that require a variety of papers.

CAE Skills Courses

The CAE also works with students to improve certain academic skill areas, such as vocabulary building and speed reading, or to build general study skills, including test preparation, time management and scheduling, note-taking and listening, critical thinking and reading, and basic learning strategies. Each semester, the CAE offers semester-long courses designed to improve students' skills regardless of their academic ability. Students register for these courses just as they would for any course at the University, and then in the first week of classes, students arrange a meeting time with the Director to go over the syllabus and discuss the work and schedule for the semester. All CAE courses are graded pass/no credit.

Travel Opportunities

BVU brings the world to our students, and our students out into the world. With our travel and global engagement experiences students will graduate as well-informed, culturally competent, and confident individuals. In the last decade, more than 100 students have studied in over twenty countries on six continents.

Through the program, our students become more confident, more articulate, more adventuresome, and more reflective. They make new friends, develop new skills, and become new and better versions of themselves. Each year, students find the perfect placement matching both their life and academic goals.

Lamberti Center for Rural Entrepreneurship

The potential to create a prosperous community lies within the power to cultivate economic growth, and the Lamberti Center for Rural Entrepreneurship strives to serve as the catalyst to revitalize our rural communities. Through the Center, new businesses will be launched, jobs will be created, individuals will be

empowered to define their future, and the ethical business leaders of tomorrow will be educated. The Center's applied programming teaches the skills to build a prosperous future for students and their communities. The Center's idea incubator, called the Foundry, supports local businesses and entrepreneurs by providing the training and resources for success and prosperity. Our goal is to help rural America not only survive—but thrive.

Institute for Agriculture

The future of the world's food and energy resources is being built right now, and students can become a part of it with an agriculture degree from BVU. Located in the heart of Midwest farming country, students have opportunities at BVU that can't be found at any other institution. Gain access to industry experts and worldrenowned businesses through experiential learning, internships, and research opportunities. As an agriculture major at BVU, students have the uncommon training and knowledge needed to run a family farm, trade commodities internationally, or pioneer new science that changes the way global resources are grown or raised.

Other Programs

Army ROTC

Army ROTC (Reserve Officers' Training Corps) is one of the best leadership courses in the country available to students with two, three, or four years of college remaining, as well as a program for graduate students. Army ROTC offers classes students can take as electives within their normal college curriculum and they can take up to the first two years of the program without having to contract to serve in the Army. The program offers not only scholarships, but an experience that students won't find anywhere else on campus. Most training takes place in the Storm Lake area combined with training twice a year at Camp Dodge in Johnston.

Student Activities Board (SAB)

BVU's Student Activities Board's (SAB) is an organization, run by students, that brings diverse social and recreational activities to campus. SAB will provide free, fun entertainment to meet the varied interests of the student body. It is hoped that these shared experiences will help students connect to each other and the BVU community. The SAB ten-member executive board leads a committee of members at large in efforts to plan multiple activities for all students each month including Midnight Movies, comedians, and bands. SAB also coordinates a weeklong Homecoming celebration each fall.

Student Senate

Student Senate is the student government organization on the BVU campus. The organization's purpose is to express the student body's concerns to the faculty and staff. The mission of the Student Senate is to act and serve as the governing body and voice of our students. The Student Senate can influence policy in the BVU community. In the past, the Senate has developed the co-ed suite option and neutral gender bathrooms.

Buenafication Day

Since its origins as "Hobo Days" in 1913, originally a relaxed and unstructured day of spirits, games, and festivities, Buenafication Day has evolved into a serious, but fun, undertaking of civic responsibility. On this day of service, which has been an annual event since around 1980, classes on our Storm Lake campus are suspended and all Beavers give back to their community.

Center for Diversity & Inclusion

The Center for Diversity & Inclusion (CDI) assists domestic students of color and international students with the transition to student life by fostering an environment that supports both personal and professional growth through Educational Outreach, Social Justice & Cultural Programming, Support & Advocacy, and Community Building. By developing opportunities for students to learn and understand the importance of multiculturalism, the CDI supports all students in broadening their perspective of diversity. The CDI enhances the visibility and awareness of diversity within our campus community by creating opportunities for students, staff, and faculty to come together for cultural exchange and celebration.
